Letter from Your President

Welcome back! It's nearly warm weather as I write this. I saw more walkers (and some bike riders) in the past few days: and heard more young people calling out to each other as I've walked Hobbs, around the north shore. It is great to see and hear you.

It's been a busy off-season for those of us on your board. Just some of the recent activity deals with:

- Working with our engineers to satisfy DEP with respect to the safety of our dam and spillway and to update our Emergency Action Plan;
- Initiating discussions with Penn Forest Township concerning the need for safety crossings on Behrens Road; and,
- A first review of our Tree Preservation Policy.

Hopefully, we will be able to offer some insight on these issues at our Spring Informational Meeting. Right now, I want to stress one thought: time flies. Before long it will be July and the election process for new board members will begin. We need to start thinking about candidates to fill the five seats that become vacant on an annual basis. This sounds like a pretty simple task, but as often happens, it becomes more complicated than simply finding five pegs to force into five holes, regardless of shape. This happens because we all have personal lives, families, varying degrees of employment and varied skill sets and, in one case, a member who is completing his third term and is ineligible to run for reelection at this time. We have another member in that group of five that, for personal reasons will not seek another term. Additionally, we have a sixth member who may be forced to leave us prior to the end of his current term (in 2020).

In addition to the "numbers game" we are playing, we can't forget about skills and specific knowledge. I'm guessing we will need to find within the 2020 election, members with financial skills that relate to Treasury, Membership Services and Special Projects (especially our proposed Declaration Rewrite project). Additionally, we can never have enough support in the areas of road maintenance and building permits review.



One of the longest running and most looked forward to event each year is the annual 4th of July Bicycle and Golf Cart Parade. So get your ideas together, think of new themes, and make plans to decorate those bikes and golf carts.

The parade will take place this year on Sat, July 6th. The parade will start promptly at 12:00 noon with registration beginning at 11:00 am. Please note that the judging will take place from 11:00 till 11:45, so plan your time accordingly. Prizes will be given for first, second, and third place and awarded after the parade. Badges must be worn. The rain date for the event will be Sun, July 7th, same times.

As of last year, the following rules have been applied as to the type of conveyances to be entered in the parade:

Questions have arisen with regards to the entry of various other conveyances in BCL's annual Golf Cart and Bicycle Parade. It has been defined that the parade, as stated, is for "golf carts" and "bikes." Golf carts are defined as small motorized vehicles used by golfers and their equipment,

which are allowed on Bear Creek roads as a pleasure vehicle. A bike has wheels that are put in motion with pedals by the rider and can be either a bicycle or tricycle. Therefore, wagons, carriages, children's battery operated vehicles, and the like will not be considered bikes. A golf cart with a trailer or cart of any kind attached will be considered a float and will not be included in the judging. We will not stop anyone from entering the parade with these kind of conveyances, but please be advised that they will not be judged. Until it can be deemed for additions of other divisions to the parade, it will remain a "Golf Cart and Bicycle Parade."






